



YMGYRCH ATAL BAWA CŴN ANTI DOG-FOULING CAMPAIGN

Yn ddiweddar, mae Cyngor Tref Sanclêr wedi gweithredu i atal perchnogion cŵn rhag gadael baw ci ar hyd y dref. Arddangoswyd posteri a ddyluniwyd gan ddisgyblion Ysgol Griffith Jones o gwmpas y dref ym mis Gorffennaf, ac yn fwy diweddar, cynhaliwyd ymgyrch 'graffiti-glân'.

Treuliodd y Cynghorwyr Ian Richards ac Irfon Price, y Ddirprwy Faer y diwrnod yn golchi negeseuon gwrth fawa cŵn ar balmentydd, llwybrau cerdded ac ambell wal o gwmpas Sanclêr. Targedwyd ardaloedd probelmatig i atgoffa'r lleiafrif o berchnogwyr cŵn sy ddim yn codi baw eu ci o'u dyletswydd i wneud hynny.

Gall yr ymgyrch yma gael ei ailadrodd tro ar ôl tro i gadw'r neges yn glir, yn targedu'r gwahanol ardaloedd yn ôl yr angen. Mae croeso i gymunedau cyfagos gysylltu â Chlerc y Cyngor Tref am fwy o wybodaeth am 'graffiti-glân' yn eu cymunedau nhw.

Recently St Clears Town Council have taken action to discourage dog owners from leaving dog mess around the town. Posters designed by pupils from Ysgol Griffith Jones were displayed around the town in July and more recently a 'clean graffiti' campaign has been implemented.

Councillors Ian Richards and Irfon Price, the Deputy Mayor, spent the day pressure washing anti dog-fouling message onto the pavements, walkways and some walls around St Clears. Problem areas were targeted to remind the minority of dog owners who don't clean up after their dogs of their responsibility to do so.

This campaign can be repeated time after time to keep the message present, targeting different areas as necessary. Neighbouring communities are welcome to contact the Clerk to the Town Council for more information about how 'clean graffiti' can be used in their communities.
