



CYNGOR TREF SANCLÊR – DATGANIAD I'R WASG

Mae Cyngor Tref Sancler, ar y cyd gydag Ysgol Griffith Jones, wedi lansio ymgyrch gwrth fawr cŵn yn Sanclêr heddiw. Yn y lansiad, cafodd yr enillwyr eu gwobrwyo gyda thalebau llyfr am eu hymdrechion i ddylunio posteri atal baw cŵn a fydd yn cael eu harddadngos yn yr ardal. Roedd y lansiad yn gyfle i ddangos stensiliau 'graffiti glân' a fydd yn cael eu defnyddio o gwmpas y dref i olchi sloganau ar balmentydd a llwybrau cerdded mewn ardaloedd problematig.

Mewn cyflwyniad i enillwyr y gystadleuaeth a gynhaliwyd gan Gyngor Tref Sanclêr, roedd y Maer Dr Edmund Davies yn canmol yn fawr y plant oedd wedi rhoi cynnig ar y gystadleuaeth. Roedd y tri poster gorau wedi'u dewis i wrthbwysu ymddygiad lleiafrif o bobl oedd yn gadael baw cŵn ar balmentydd a gwair.

Gobeithir bydd y posteri hyn, a'r stensiliau 'graffiti glân' mewn llefydd cyhoeddus yn golygu bod ardaloedd yn glir o faw cŵn.

Pwyleisiodd y Maer waith caled ac ymrwymiad y Cynghorydd Ian Richards a'r Pwyllgor Amgylchedd o dan gadeiryddiaeth y Cynghorydd Philip Rogers am gychwyn a chwblhau y prosiect gwerthfawr yma.

Gall y prosiect hwn fod yn enghriaft i drefi a phentrefi eraill o'r hyn y gellid gwneud i ddelio â phroblemau tebyg yn eu hardaloedd nhw.

St Clears Town Council have, in conjunction with Ysgol Griffith Jones, launched an anti-dog fouling campaign in St Clears this morning. The launch at the school saw the winners of a poster competition being awarded with book tokens for their efforts to design anti dog-fouling posters that will be displayed in the area. The launch was also an opportunity to show the new 'clean graffiti' stencils that will be used around the town to pressure wash anti dog-fouling slogans onto pavements and walkways in problem areas.

At a presentation to the winners of a competition held under the auspices of St Clears Town Council, the Mayor Dr Edmund gave copious praise to all the children

who entered the competition. The three best posters were chosen to discourage the behaviour of a minority of people who allow dog mess to remain on the pavements and grassed areas. It is hoped that the presence of these posters, and the new 'clean graffiti' stencilling in public places will result in areas being free of dog mess.

The Mayor emphasised the hard work and dedication of Councillor Ian Richards and the Environment Committee under the chairmanship of Councillor Philip Rogers for initiating and completing this worthwhile project.

This project could be an example to other towns and villages of what can be done to address similar problems in their areas.
